Overall project updates:	This grant supported efforts to provide the essential resources of diapers and baby hygiene supplies to families whose basic needs are unmet due to gaps in our social safety net. Through partnership with 4 community-based organizations in Buncombe County, we exceeded our initial goals, and distributed 28,906 diapers, 559 packs of baby wipes; 166 tubes of diaper rash cream; and 46 hygiene items (soap, lotion). The impact is that more families had access to diaper assistance programs in Buncombe County, more caregivers had access to what they needed to keep their babies' bottoms clean, dry and healthy.
Indicators of service quality: <i>(How well did we do it?)</i>	We set a goal to distribute 8,500 diapers by bringing on new partners who had previously been waitlisted, and who served specific communities we weren't already reaching with other partners. We exceeded this goal for these new partners by 240%, distributing 28,906 diapers (as well as other diapering and hygiene essentials). We will continue to support these partners with diaper assistance beyond the end of this grant.
Result/Outcome: <i>(Is anyone better off)</i>	This grant helped serve 1,300 non-unique children experiencing diaper need in Buncombe County, an average of 100 unique children every month. This has provided physical relief and comfort for children, and financial, practical and emotional relief to parents. For just one example of this impact, a partner shared "We have a single mom who shared with us that the diapers brought peace to her as she has struggled to have what she needs for her daughter. It gave her peace and hope knowing that her daughter was in clean diapers and could be taken care of."
