
Buncombe County Schools and Verner Capital Project at Emma Elementary School Fact Sheet





Project Summary

- Capital project to construct a new, 10classroom child care center on the campus of Emma Elementary School
- Center will serve approximately 100 children, with 68 new slots created (to be filled from current wait list and new families; mostly infant and toddler slots, the greatest need in our community)
- Verner will hire 22 additional staff and faculty to work in the new facility (recruitment through targeted outreach beyond Buncombe County)
- Center will include engaging, age-appropriate outdoor learning environments

Project Impact

The new building's 10 classrooms will provide:

- > 32 current slots:
 - 3 current Early Head Start (EHS) classrooms (8 children each = 24 slots)
 - o 8 existing EHS Home-Based slots
- 68 additional slots:
 - 4 new 0-3 classrooms (8 children each = 32 slots)
 - o 2 new pre-k classrooms (18 children each = 36 slots)

Workforce development: Lab school opportunities for BCS ECE Career and Technical Education.

Partnerships: Community collaborations to support family leaders and increased peer support opportunities.

 - o \$685,313 request pending (1-year or 2-year; a 2-year grant would *not* increase financing costs thanks to the timing of payments due to Mobile Modular)

\$0 If pending ECEDF grant is fully awarded by 4/30/21 – even over 2 years – there will be no funding gap.

Unanticipated Cost Increases Since February 2020

- Additional building and outdoor learning environment: \$387,854
- > Paving of new road: \$381,777
- Financing multi-year grants at 2% rate: \$23,000*
- > Total net cost increases since 2/14/20: \$792,631

*On 4/20/21, Dogwood Health Trust committed to an Impact Investing bridge loan for the project at a 2% interest rate, reducing the cost of financing from \$200,000 to \$23,000.

Spring 2021 ECE and Development Fund Request

\$685,313 reduced funding request:

- > \$580,000: Building and outdoor learning environment
- \$82,313: Other project costs
- > \$23,000: Financing multi-year grants

**If full project funding is committed by 4/30/21, the new center should be operational by September 2021 (starting with 3 existing classrooms and 8 Home-Based slots = 32 current slots); at full capacity no later than June 2022.
