

Buncombe Child Population




Current number of children birth through 5 years old (and not age eligible for kindergarten) = 12,752

TYPES OF EARLY CARE & EDUCATION

All care is regulated by NC Division of Child Development and Early Education (NC DCDEE):

- Licensed programs (more than 4 hours)
- Part-day, unlicensed regulated programs
 (4 hours or less)

Types of licensed programs (ages 0-5):

- Child Care Centers 83
- Family Child Care Homes (FCCH) 11
- Afterschool only licensed programs (ages 5-12) 17
- Total licensed programs (0-12) 111

Publicly-funded programs that make care more affordable for parents:


- Head Start (3- to 5-year-olds)
- Early Head Start (0- to 2-year-olds)
- NC Pre Kindergarten (4-year-olds)

COVID-19 IMPACT

Child care was identified as an essential service under the Stay Home, Stay Safe order. Centers that wished to remain open and agreed to meet updated health, safety and operational guidelines applied to NC DCDEE to remain open or reopen following a short closure. Enrollment continues to remain low due to workforce shortages. DCDEE continues to provide stabilization grants for salary increases.

QUALITY

How is quality defined in NC?


- North Carolina uses a Quality Rating Improvement System (QRIS), which has a 1-5 star scale.
- 4- and 5-star-rated programs are considered high quality in NC.
- This scale is made up of two components:
 - 1) Staff Education
 - 2) Program Standards
- Program standards are measured by NC Division of Child Development and Early Education using the Environment Rating Scale assessment every three years.
- Religious-sponsored programs (GS110s) do not receive a rating, unless they choose to apply.
- The QRIS system is voluntary.
 Licensed facilities may choose to optout and receive a one-star rating.


Average Star Rating - All Children





AVAILABILITY OVER TIME - LICENSED FACILITIES (AGES 0-12)




BUNCOMBE ENROLLMENT OVER TIME IN LICENSED FACILITIES (AGES 0-12)

Total Children Served (0-5)




BUNCOMBE ENROLLMENT OVER TIME IN LICENSED FACILITIES (AGES 0-5)

SLOTS AVAILABLE BY SHIFT

More and more parents are finding employment that doesn't adhere to the standard Monday-Friday, 9-to-5 work schedule. Besides working outside of normal business hours, a subsection of these parents may also work hours that vary week to week. Despite the growing need for nonstandard-hours care, there has been very little research on how states and communities are supporting families in this situation.

In Buncombe County:

5 family child care homes are licensed to serve a total of **40** children during second shift

0 family child care homes are licensed to serve children during third shift.

During the month of September 2022, the most recent report available, **zero** children were being served with second shift care.

AFFORDABILITY

- In NC, the average annual cost of center based care for an infant is \$9,254 and \$7,412 in a family child care home.
- There are several options to help families pay for care if they meet income eligibility and other guidelines, including Early Head Start, Head Start, NC Pre-Kindergarten, and child care subsidies. Detailed information is available here.
- Parents receiving child care subsidies must pay parent fees of 10% of family gross income and the difference between the voucher reimbursement rate and the advertised cost of the slot, or the differential rate.
- Wrap-around care (extended hours before or after the official program hours) is an additional cost to families and may not be available depending on the program site, sometimes making care difficult for working parents.






Average Star Rating - Subsidy

Subsidized High Quality Care




THE BUNCOMBE WORKFORCE – BY THE NUMBERS

- Number of teachers = 699
- Number of administrators = 103
- Number of support staff = 33
- On average, the early care and education teaching staff made \$13.37 per hour and directors made \$24.00 per hour.
- WAGE\$ salary supplement program participants = 110 teacher/administrators in 49 facilities
- Turnover rate of WAGE\$ recipients = 18%
- TEACH Early Childhood scholarship program = 73 participants in 26 facilities
- Facilities receiving unrestricted Smart Start grants from Buncombe Partnership for Children to maintain high quality = 66






EDUIO – Buncombe is below minimum standard





Percent of children enrolled in 1-5 star centers that have at least 75% of lead teachers with associate's degrees






H10a – Buncombe is within the expected range
