Buncombe County 2043 Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee Meeting 5:00 P.M. - 7:00 P.M.

April 12, 2022 Hybrid (In-Person and Virtual)

Summary

Meeting Objective: Develop general questions to ask the public about potential future policy direction through Community Engagement Window #2. These ideas will be developed from (1) a review of CEW #1 and Stakeholder Survey findings, and (2) Factbook findings.

The meeting began with a welcome and approval of minutes. The meeting facilitators shared updates on Community Engagement Window #1 and a review of the planning process.

Progress on Phase 2 included additional virtual stakeholder interviews, continued outreach for the Stakeholder Survey, Community Engagement Window #1, and Factbook Development.

Discussion

Small Group Discussion Questions

Participants split up into 3 groups (2 in person groups and 1 virtual group) to discuss Community Engagement Window #1 results from the PublicInput.com reports and the Factbook/Technical Analysis, both shared via email.

Participants watched the <u>Factbook Highlights</u> video.

Each group had a Round Robin discussion to answer the following questions:

- What issues/opportunities rise to the top that are candidates for policy change?
- What questions do we need to ask the public in upcoming public engagement opportunities regarding that potential policy change?

Common Threads

A few topics were common across the different group discussions:

- **Housing:** affordability and diversity of housing stock, policy changes for density, rentals, and Airbnb's; options to incentivize lower rents
- **infrastructure and energy:** broadband expansion, sustainable energy sources for residents (including solar); cost and implementation for infrastructure expansions, such as public water and sewer
- Economic Development: support apprenticeship model and trades; childcare for workforce
