Welcome and agenda review by Jasmine Beach-Ferrara. Tech tutorial by Burnett Walz. Teleconference option available for all who would like to join meetings. Public comment at end. Applicants not eligible to address committee regarding their application.

Legal update

Attorney Michael Frue explained that the NC House and Senate recently passed legislation around public remote/virtual meetings. If everyone in the meeting can't be seen, there must be a roll call. Any time a member speaks, they must identify themselves. All votes must be performed by roll call. Any chats, communications by instant messages, texts, etc. will be public records and must be preserved.

Minutes

A motion was made by Kit Cramer and seconded by Susan Mims to approve minutes from April 21, 2020. The vote to approve the motion was unanimous.

New Business

Applicant Funding Question Responses – Responses from applicants have been compiled and distributed to the committee. This includes questions specific to each program provided as "Committee Funding Questions" as well as two other items: Impacts of COVID-19 on the program/funding request; and minimum amount of funding needed to effectively carry out and execute the project outlined in the application. Additional information was sent regarding Southwestern Child Development summarizing staff conversations to gather further information provided by Southwestern with project history. Rachael Nygaard reviewed this information verbally with the committee.

Scoring Model – In preparation for this meeting, committee members were provided a scoring model template that reflects revised funding levels requested by the applicants. Request from Leslie Anderson to reclassify Asheville City Schools Hall Fletcher which was listed as creating new classrooms but should be listed as supporting capacity and/or quality for existing programs.

Funding Scenarios – The committee requested to see the modified requests for each organization due to COVID as a funding scenario to see the new overall total for requests. Burnett calculated 2 scenarios – one with the higher request and one with the lower request. The lower request comes in \$108,701 over available funds. The committee discussed multiple scenarios to finalize the recommendation for a total of \$3,672,000 in FY2020 grants.
