Follow-ups From Last Meeting

- **Child Development Associate (CDA) Credential**
 - National credential being implemented in North Carolina, based on a core set of competency standards that guide early childhood professionals toward becoming qualified educators of young children (see meeting packet)
- **Dogwood Health Trust**
 - **“Care and Learning (CandL) Data on Early Care and Education” Report** statewide listening tour into 13 WNC counties and hear first-hand the concerns and needs of parents, caregivers and child care providers in those counties (see link: <https://dogwoodhealthtrust.org/strategic-priority/education/>)
 - **List of Grants to address early childhood educator workforce recruitment, retention, and attrition** (see meeting packet)



Looking Ahead to FY2025

- “Building Capacity in Buncombe County to Expand NC Pre-K Availability and Accessibility”
 - Administered by Buncombe Partnership for Children
 - Funded by County Commissioners at the recommendation of this committee
 - Paid for with federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) COVID Recovery Funds
 - \$3,201,546 for a 2-year pilot beginning July 2022
 - Year 1 report published July 2023: www.buncombecounty.org/prekreport
 - Funding current expires September 30, 2024 (during FY2025)
 - Currently projecting to have \$186,000 remaining that could be used extend the federal award timeframe
 - Estimating \$1,069,000 additional needed in FY2025 to continue the program



Staff Recommendation

- Invite Buncombe Partnership for Children to submit a proposal through the FY2025 grant application process
- If funded:

Total available for FY2025	\$4,104,330*
-Estimated NC Pre-K expansion request	\$1,069,000
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Amount remaining for other grants	\$3,035,330

*including new & carryforward funds

Prioritizing Workforce Development in the Early Childhood Grants

- “Develop/Diversify Early Childhood Workforce” is currently 1 of 5 overall strategies for projects to apply under
