Quarter 1	<p>"The Respite Scholarship Program provided stipends for families of children with emotional, behavioral, and/or medical health issues or families impacted by risk factors. We were able to support 13 families and 28 children during this first quarter to help pay for childcare.</p> <p>These funds were used to obtain quality respite services for their children. Respite care provided temporary relief for parents and was shown through our satisfaction surveys to reinforce behavioral and developmental skills, reduce out-of-home placements, and decrease negative behaviors. Parents had some time away from their kiddos for self-care, making them better parents.</p> <p>Parents were responsible for choosing and hiring their own Respite Provider(s). Respite providers worked directly for parents to provide safe, structured, and developmentally appropriate experiences for your children. In addition, parents provided orientation, supervision, and any necessary on-the-job training specific to the individualized needs of their child. Stipends allowed parents to hire a Respite Provider directly. It was up to the parents to arrange for what made sense in their lives and was most helpful. The family decided when they wanted someone to watch their kiddo and how much to pay them. "</p>
Quarter 2	<p>The Respite Scholarship Program provided stipends for families of children with emotional, behavioral, and/or medical health issues or families impacted by risk factors. We were able to support 56 families(Q1 13 and Q2 43) and 102 children year to date (Q1 28 and Q2 74) to help pay for childcare. We have exceeded the number contracted for the year.</p> <p>We met the goals of increasing protective factors to families as measured in our surveys:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Families improvement in parental resilience 100%56 of 56 2. Caregiver's stress levels after receiving respite services 100%56 of 56 3. Families improvement in concrete support in times of need 100% 56 of 56 4. Families improvement in social connections 100% 56 of 56

We were able to support 57 families(Q1 13, Q2 56, Q3 57 total) and 103 children year to date (Q1 28, Q2 102, and Q3 103 total) to help pay for childcare.
