The Western North Carolina Regional Air Quality Agency Board of Directors met on Monday, September 12, 2011, at the boardroom of the Western North Carolina Regional Air Quality Agency, located at 49 Mt. Carmel Road, Asheville, NC.

Mr. Lovin called the meeting of the Western North Carolina Regional Air Quality Agency Board of Directors to order on September 12, 2011, at approximately 4:00 p.m.

The order of business was as follows:

I. PUBLIC COMMENT PROTOCOL ANNOUNCEMENT:

Mr. Lovin started the meeting by reading the announcement about the public comment protocol.

II. APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

There were no other changes to the Agenda and Mr. Koon made a motion for approval. Ms. Cloninger seconded the motion and it was approved 5-0.

III. CONSENT AGENDA:

<u>Approval of minutes from the July 11, 2011 Board Meeting:</u> Mr. Koon noted that Mr. Bothwell did not attend the July meeting. With that change Mr. Kirk made a motion to approve the minutes and Dr. Kahl seconded the motion. The motion passed 5-0.

IV. <u>DIRECTOR'S REPORT:</u>

Mr. Brigman informed the Board members that the city and county permit review charges are moving forward. Crowell Farms has submitted a work plan and is working on finding a solution to the complaints. The engineering and monitoring staff has submitted their Quality Management Plan (QMP) to EPA. EPA decided not to lower the ozone standard this year but leave it as is until 2013 when it is scheduled to change.

- A. SO2 and NO2 Attainment Boundary Update: EPA has recently updated the SO2 (sulfur dioxide) and NO2 (nitrogen dioxide) standards. Ashley Featherstone explained the process to the Board and how the EPA comes up with their designations and classifications. Since we do not monitor for SO2 or NO2, we will be classified as unclassifiable attainment.
- **B.** Quarterly Report -2^{nd} Quarter 2011: Board members had a copy of the Quarterly Report for 2^{nd} quarter and there were no questions.

Ms. Cloninger seconded the motion and it was approved 5-0. Mr. Brigman explained that the permit modification for Kearfott had nothing to do with their violation. Mr. Fahrer briefly went over the changes then Mr. Kirk made a motion to approve the permit and Mr. Koon seconded. It was approved 5-0.

VI. NEW BUSINESS:

A. <u>Legal Council Report – Mr. Euler:</u> Mr. Euler stated he would be looking at the civil penalty for Kearfott. There was a brief discussion, and then Mr. Brigman stated that he and Mr. Euler would come back to the Board with an amount of the settlement. Mr. Koon made a motion to allow Mr. Brigman and Mr. Euler to discuss settlement with Kearfott and Mr. Kirk seconded the motion. It was approved 5-0.

VII. OTHER BUSINESS:

- **A.** Advisory Committee Report Dean Kahl: The committee is working on the website and has made a few changes. The next meeting is Monday, October 19th. They will look at several items for the agency and will bring some things before the members at the next meeting. Dr. Kahl also informed the Board that the Health Dept. is looking at a flag program for ozone.
