We will start this ozone season at the new sight in Bent Creek. We may possibly have to purchase a new particulate monitor soon. We will look at the cost and come back to the Board for approval. Mr. Lovin asked about the old building at the Forest Service location. Mr. Brigman stated that we have not heard from them as to their interest in keeping the building.
