RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION TO THE ASHEVILLE REGIONAL HOUSING CONSORTIUM FOR HOME FUNDS AND APPROVAL OF HOUSING PROJECTS

WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. 19992 dated March 10, 1992, the Board of Commissioners for the County of Buncombe agreed to participate in the Asheville Regional Housing Consortium, wherein participating jurisdictions would undertake a cooperative approach for the application of funds under the HOMI housing program; and	
WHEREAS,	the Asheville Regional Housing Consortium will be applying to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for HOME grant funds, and Buncombe County is eligible to apply to the consortium for projects to be included in the consortium's application for affordable housing activities in the region and	
WHEREAS,	Buncombe County desires to apply for or otherwise designate \$241,496 in HOME funds and \$75,000 in County Matching funds to support certain projects to provide affordable housing opportunities for low income persons in Buncombe County, said projects being further described in Exhibit A; and	
WHEREAS,	County funds used to support the 2013 HOME program and related housing services have been requested under the Capital Improvements Program; and	
WHEREAS,	the Board of Commissioners desires to utilize these funds to provide safe, affordable, and standard housing in the County and believes that these projects will contribute toward attaining the consortium' goals and serving affordable housing needs in the County.	
NOW, THERE	FORE,	BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Buncombe as follows:
	1.	That the Board of Commissioners hereby approves the submission of an application to the Asheville Regional Housing Consortium for HOME funds to support those projects summarized in Exhibit A.
	2.	That the Chairman be and he is hereby authorized to execute the application forms, funding agreements, and contract documents as necessary for the County to receive funds from the Consortium for the purpose of undertaking these projects.
	3.	That, if applicants receive other HOME funds through the Consortium and it is determined by the Consortium that these applicants should undertake the projects directly through the Consortium, the Board of Commissioners approves the designation of HOME funds identified in Exhibit A for said projects.
	4.	That the County Manager be and she is hereby authorized to execute agreements with applicants as necessary to undertake activities under the HOME program.
	5.	That this Resolution shall be effective upon its adoption.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION TO THE ASHEVILLE REGIONAL HOUSING CONSORTIUM FOR HOME FUNDS AND APPROVAL OF HOUSING PROJECTS

CURRENT STATUS:

Through the 2013 HOME Program, funding is available for affordable housing projects. As a member government of the Asheville Regional Housing Consortium, Buncombe County will be applying to the Consortium for approximately \$241,496 under the HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME Program), and has designated \$75,000 in County Matching funds. Funds are provided on a reimbursement basis for costs associated with providing for the affordable housing needs of very low and low income persons through activities eligible under the HOME Program.

BACKGROUND SUMMARY:

Buncombe County advertised for project applications from qualified agencies and organizations to administer and deliver eligible housing activities with funds provided under the HOME program. Applications were received. Project applications have been reviewed and evaluated, and priority projects have been identified through Exhibit A of the Resolution.
