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OBJECTIVES

1. Describe the importance of lethality assessment in battering relationships
2. Describe other risk assessment instruments
3. Describe the process of lethality assessment using the DA
4. Identify psychometric properties of the DA
5. Assess lethality using weighted scoring on the DA
6. Describe safety planning based on use of the DA

Buncombe County Government (BCG), with the help of community partners, the courts, law enforcement and local municipalities, is launching a comprehensive plan to address domestic violence. The plan has 6 main components:

- Lethality Assessments – evaluating danger to victims
- High Risk Team – offender & victim interventions
- Electronic Monitoring – tracking offenders for victim safety
- Focused Deterrence – prevention strategies for previous offenders
- Cross System Dialogue – improving communication
- Public Education Campaign – increasing awareness and community engagement

The goal of the comprehensive plan is to educate, connect and inspire to end violence against women in Buncombe County. An important first step is to train stakeholders in a common lethality assessment; BCG and MAHEC are offering a free training on Danger Assessment (DA). The DA is an instrument which helps to determine the level of danger an abused woman has of being killed by her intimate partner. The tool was developed by Jacquelyn Campbell with consultation and content validity support from battered women, shelter workers, law enforcement officials, and other clinical experts on battering.

The continuing education program will give participants background and instruction on how to administer the DA to victims, the weighted scoring for the DA, the resulting levels of danger and what kinds of safety strategies are recommended at each level. Participants will be eligible for certification in the DA at the completion of the session and will receive directions on how to obtain and use the certification. DA certification is provided by Johns Hopkins School of Nursing and the cost is \$25 paid to Johns Hopkins School of Nursing for those who are interested. Attendance to this program is free, but there is a charge for participants who desire Continuing Education Credits provided by MAHEC.

FACULTY

Jacquelyn C. Campbell, PhD, RN, FAAN, is the Anna D. Wolf Endowed Chair and a Professor in the Johns Hopkins University School of Nursing with a joint appointment in the Bloomberg School of Public Health as well as the National Program Director of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Nurse Faculty Scholars Program. Her BSN, MSN and PhD are from Duke University, Wright State University and the University of Rochester Schools of Nursing. She has been engaged in advocacy policy work and research in domestic violence since 1980.

Dr. Campbell has been the Principal Investigator of 12 major NIH, NIJ and CDC research grants and published more than 220 articles and seven books on this subject, including the textbook *Family Violence and Nursing Practice* with Janice Humphreys. She has received numerous awards including elected membership in the Institute of Medicine and the American Academy of Nursing, three honorary doctorates, the Pathfinder Award from FNINR, and is Co-Chair of the IOM Forum on Global Violence Prevention. Dr. Campbell is a member of the Board of Directors of Futures Without Violence, was a member of the congressionally appointed US Department of Defense Task Force on Domestic Violence, and has been a board member at three shelters.
