WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

You may be eligible for VA health care benefits if you are a veteran.

You may be eligible for other VA benefits if you are:

- A veteran
- A veteran's dependent
- A surviving spouse or child of a deceased veteran
- A member of the Reserves or National Guard
- An Active Duty service member

HELPFUL ITEMS TO BRING WITH YOU TO YOUR APPOINTMENT:

- Identification
- Social Security number
- Proof of residency (drivers license, lease, tax documents)
- Proof of citizenship (birth certificate, passport etc.)
- Proof of Income (check stubs, etc.)
- Banking and asset info
- Unpaid medical bills
- Utility bills
- Child care receipts
- Rent or mortgage receipts
- Property Ownership
- Current Veteran's Benefits
- Veteran's Discharge Certificate

While these items may be necessary to process your application, they are not required at the time of your request for services. Additional information may be requested.
