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A \$246 million national initiative to reduce over-incarceration and advance racial equity in local criminal justice systems by changing the way America thinks about and uses jails.

The grant brings the Foundation's total investment in Buncombe County to \$3.55 million to date.

There are 21 implementation sites nationwide, including Buncombe County, implementing reforms to make their local justice system more equitable and more effective.

Buncombe County has surpassed the original SJC goal to reduce the jail population by 15% with the average monthly population declining by 30% between February 2019 and January 2021.

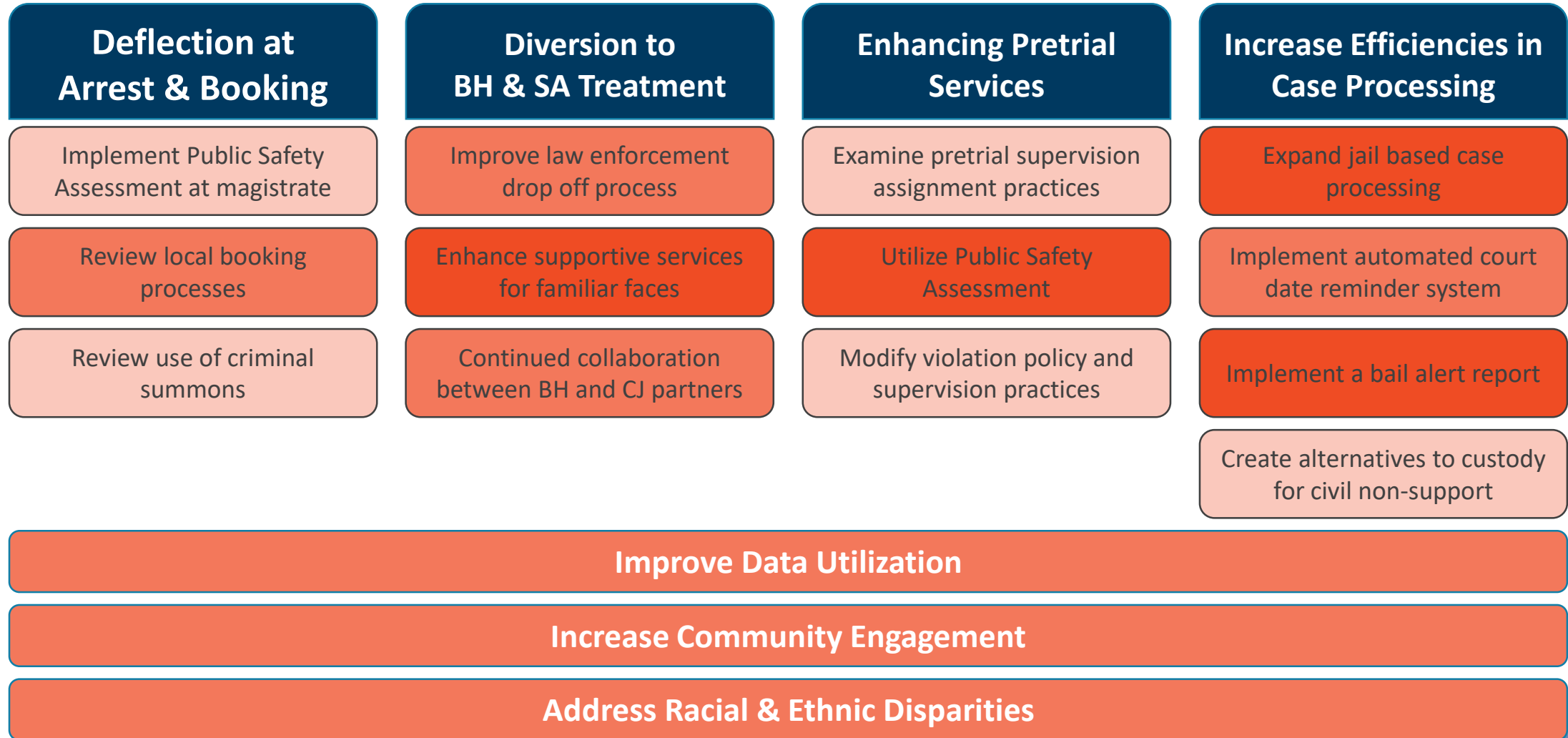

SJC Key Outcomes 2018-2021

- **Safely reduce the jail population:**
 - Original goal of 15% reduction (target of 327).
 - Lowest point in July 2020, when ADP reached 262 (a 42% decrease).
 - Current ADP hovering around the original SJC target (3/22/21 ADP was 318).
- **Not seeing related increases in crime:**
 - Total incidents reported from Mar-Aug 2020 was 5.6% less than in 2019
 - Lower recidivism rates for those released: 14% of those released on own recognizance/unsecured bonds between Mar-Jun 2020 returned to custody in 2 months, compared to 17% prior to COVID.

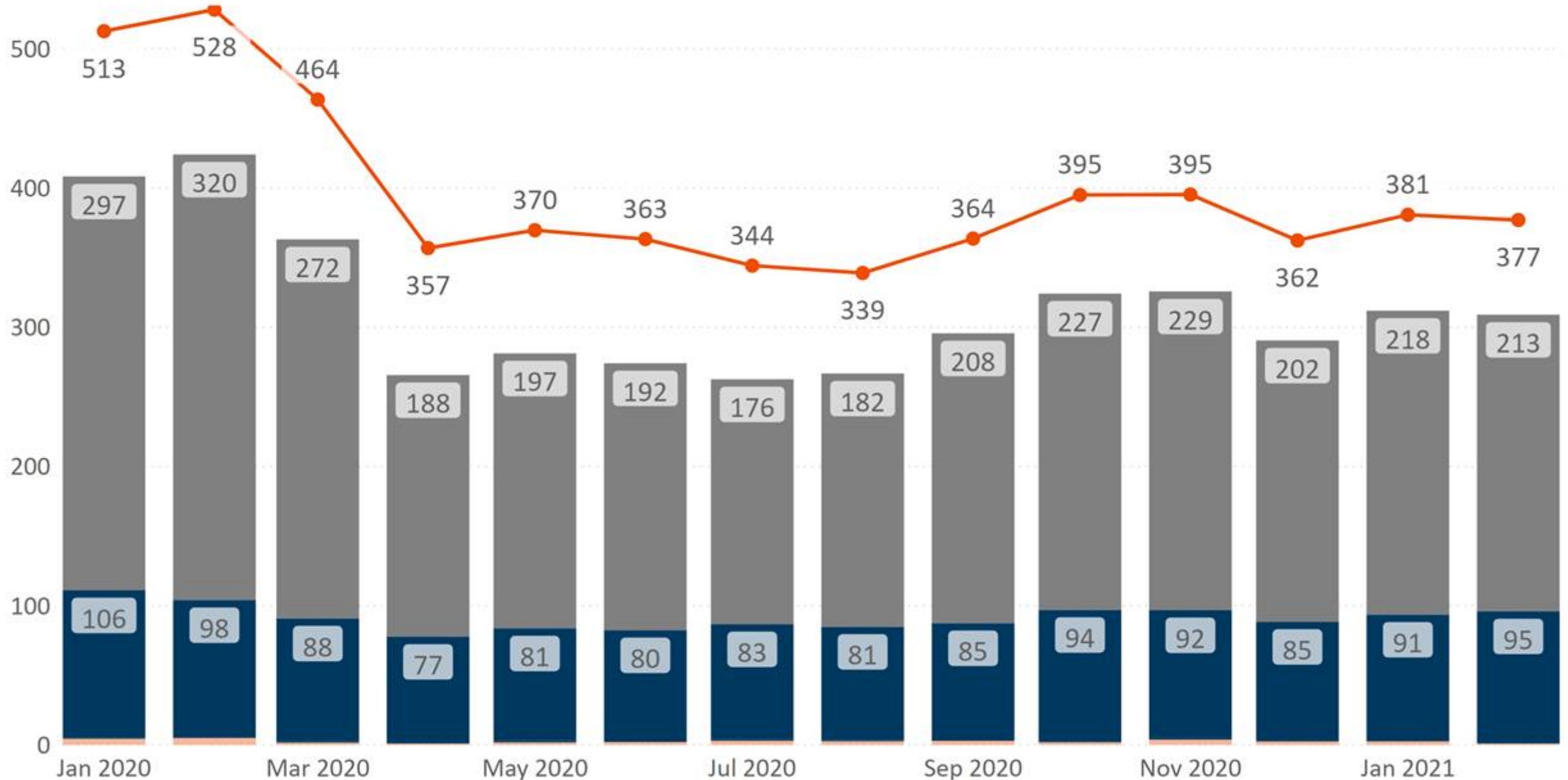

SJC Goals 2021-2023

- Sustaining Jail Population Reductions
- Reducing Racial & Ethnic Disparities
- Building Community Engagement and Trust



2021-2023 SJC Renewal Strategies

Enhancing Pretrial Release Strategies

- Implement PSA at magistrates
- Maintain use of non-financial release conditions at the levels seen during COVID
- Increase pre-arrest and jail diversion strategies

Increasing Efficiencies in Case Processing

- Continue Jail Review Team
- Increase use of court notification system
- Increase early access to defense counsel

Advancing Racial Equity

- Hire Racial Equity Consultant
- Use Racial Equity Tool
- Ongoing education and training
- Partner with community to identify root causes driving increasing racial inequities and co-design solutions

Increasing Community Engagement

- Increase understanding of justice system
- Partner with community to identify root causes and develop interventions to address drivers of incarceration, including FTAs and violence
- Support establishment of Drivers' License Restoration Initiative

Advancing Community Safety and Violence Prevention

- Partner with community organizations to address community safety
- Develop Strategic Plan with justice stakeholders



Potential Opportunity: Focused Racial Equity Cohort

Participation in the Focused Racial Equity Cohort

- Investment of \$500K over 2 years
 - Split equally between government/system agency ***and*** community partner
- Continued access to SJC Network peers and resources
- Additional TA on racial equity and authentic community engagement
- Regular cohort convenings
