COVID Recovery Funding

- American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Federal aid to state & local governments
- Coronavirus State & Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (CSLFRF)
 - Direct, flexible funding from U.S. Treasury
 - Funds to invest toward recovery from COVID-19 and its negative economic impacts
- Buncombe County allocation: \$50.7 Million



How the Funds Were Used

The Housing Authority of the City of Asheville (HACA) addressed educational disparities through aid to high-poverty districts through its Chosen PODS Summer Camp program, utilizing ARPA funds to fund Youth Impact Workers (high school and college students), pay for camper meals, and provide transportation for camper swimming and field trips. HACA engaged with community partners including Western Carolina Rescue Ministries to provide a safe and educational camp experience for youth between the ages of 6-14 living in the Southside, Hillcrest, Pisgah View, and Deaverview housing communities. The camp included math and reading tutoring for campers, in addition to structured recreational activities. The project intended to help break the cycles of poverty and close the achievement gap for over 140 at-risk youth by providing a two-month long summer camp.



Results

113 students served 26 Youth Impact Workers employed

85% attendance rate

85% of students self-reported their desire to achieve academic success

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Community Impact

- 206 jobs created
- 733 jobs retained

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- 174 housing units built
- 44 house repairs completed
- 559 households received rent or utility bill assistance
- 42 shelter beds added in the community
- 349 individuals received shelter services
- 2,886 individuals received crisis support
- 5,829 individuals and families received legal aid and advocacy support

Proposed Allocations

- <u>Reimagining Deaverview Phase I</u>: Reduce by \$935,286 and close the project
- Broadband Infrastructure Expansion: Reduce by \$1,000,000
- + <u>Community Paramedic Collaborative</u>: Increase by \$514,085
- + <u>Capital Outlay Equipment:</u> New project for \$1,421,201

Reducing these projects will increase the amount available that can be allocated to new projects to **\$1,935,286**
