
COMPARISON

- County-wide focus


SMALL AREA PLAN

CHALLENGES

1. Grant funding may require specific topics or actions be included in the Plan (ex: A health-focused plan)

2.Grant funding increases administrative work for staff

3.Disaster related trauma = significant sensitivity with residents that staff may not understand or be trained for

4.Locating and engaging with displaced residents

5.Community buy-in for the process

6.Competing interests





GRANTS

- Staff are actively looking for grants to help fund the planning process
- Free technical assistance could help reduce consultant costs
- Philanthropic funding may be more realistic given the Federal funding landscape
