



### FEMA Assistance- **Apply by April 7**

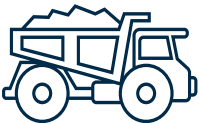
- Apply for assistance at [disasterassistance.gov](https://disasterassistance.gov) or call the FEMA helpline: 800-621-3362
- FEMA assistance may include money for home repairs, housing assistance, personal property losses or other uninsured, disaster-related needs like childcare, transportation, medical, farm and work related tools or equipment, and private road/ bridge repairs. The **deadline to apply for FEMA is April 7, 2025.**
- Visit a Disaster Recovery Center (DRC) Hours at all locations are 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday-Friday and 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturdays.

### Free Private Property Debris Removal Services **Deadline Approaching Apply by April 15**

Buncombe County property owners (residential or commercial) who do not have debris removal insurance, may apply to have qualified disaster debris removed from at no cost through the Private Property Debris Removal (PPDR) Program. The program also covers the demolition of eligible unsafe structures or threatening trees. Call the One Buncombe Call Center at 828-250-6100 select option 2.

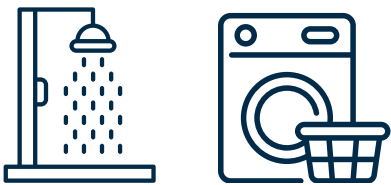


## NEW: Agriculture Crop Loss Program **Apply by May 2**

If you are an agricultural producer who lost crops due to Helene or other natural disasters in 2024, a new funding program will be available to help with the monetary losses. You will need a copy of the Farm Service Agency’s Producer Form “FSA 578” from your local USDA-FSA office.
