Contract Synopsis: Using grant funds, this contract provides an Intake Specialist for the first two years. Intake specialists greet clients and escort them into client dens, explain available services from the multiple partner agencies including law enforcement, review confidentiality policies, coordinate initial service provision and develop safety plans with victims.


Reporting Highlights:

- 687 total DOJ funded intakes
- 93.5% identified as female
- 90.8% were domestic violence victimizations
- 26.6% of services provided were victim / survivor advocacy
- Of those surveyed
 - 87.7% indicated they had a safety plan
 - 83.8% reported a decrease in fear and anxiety after initial intake.

Performance Measures: Client Demographics*

- Reporting period: October 1, 2021 through December 31, 2023
- Total intakes for reporting period: 1,247
- Total DOJ funded intakes**: 687
 - 68.0% (467) identified as White
 - 16.7% (115) identified as Black or African American
 - 8.6% (59) identified as Hispanic or Latinx
 - 3.1% (21) identified as Other
 - 1.7% (12) identified as American Indian or Alaska Native







Performance Measures: Client Demographics

- Total DOJ funded intakes: 687
 - 93.4% (642) identified as female
 - 5.1% (35) identified as male
 - 1.5% (10) identified as transgender
 - 80.6% (554) were in the 25 59 years old age group
 - 14.4% (99) were in the 18 24 years old age group
 - 3.6% (25) were in the 60+ years old age group








Performance Measures: Special Classification

- Total special classifications: 444
 - 27.5% (122) identified as LGBTQ individuals
 - 26.4% (117) identified as disabled
 - 24.3% (108) identified as living in rural areas
 - 10.8% (48) identified as having limited **English proficiency**
 - 10.6% (47) identified as immigrants / refugees / asylum seekers

Total by victimization types:

Domestic violence: 90.8% (625)


Sexual assault: 8.4% (58)

• Stalker: 0.7% (5)

Total number of victimizations: 688

- 64.5% (444) of survivors experienced domestic violence by a current or former spouse or intimate partner
- 25.4% (175) of survivors experienced domestic violence by a current or former dating relationship
- 1.5% (10) of survivors experience sexual assault from a stranger
- 0.3% (2) of survivors experienced sexual assault from an acquaintance (neighbor, employee, co-worker, student, schoolmate, etc.)

Relationship to Offender By Victimization Type



Performance Measures: Types of services provided*

- Total services provided: 1,706
 - **Crisis intervention** identifying, assessing, and intervening with an individual in crisis: 32.3% (551)
 - Victim / survivor advocacy actions designed to assist the victim /survivor in obtaining support, resources or services such as employment, housing, shelter services, health care, etc: 26.6% (454)
 - Civil legal advocacy / court accompaniment assisting a victim / survivor with civil legal issues such as paperwork preparation for a protection order or accompaniment to civil court proceeding: 21.6% (369)
 - Criminal justice advocacy / court accompaniment –
 assisting a victim / survivor with criminal legal issues
 including notification of case status, hearing dates, pleas
 agreements, and sentencing terms; paperwork preparation
 and accompaniment to criminal court proceedings: 17.1%
 (292)
 - Language services interpretation, translation: 0.8% (13)
 - **Transportation**: 1.1% (18)

Total Services Provided By Type of Service




Additional Intake Statistics

Total Survivors Who Accessed Multiple Services




Post Intake Survey Results

- Total number of optional post intake surveys completed: 334
 - 87.7% (293) of survivors indicated they had a safety plan
 - 83.8% (280) of survivors indicated that they experienced a decrease in fear and anxiety
