






#### Types of Victimizations

## Performance Measures: Polyvictimization\* Types of Victimization

- There were 119 survivors who reported multiple victimizations
- There were 357 responses to the types of victimizations experienced by survivors
  - 53.2% (190) of survivor responses indicated survivor had experienced domestic violence
  - 22.7% (81) of survivor responses reported stalking/harassment
  - 14.3% (51) of survivor responses reported child physical abuse or neglect
  - 4.5% (16) of survivor responses reported adult sexual assault
  - 2.8% (10) of survivor responses reported child sexual abuse or assault




\*Polyvictimization refers to having experienced multiple victimizations and emphasizes experiencing different kinds of victimization rather than multiple episodes of the same kind of victimization.



## Performance Measures: Special classification

- 115 instances of special classifications
  - 53.0% (61) identified as homeless
  - 20.9% (24) identified as victims with disabilities
  - 13.9% (16) identified as victims with limited English proficiency
  - 7.8% (9) identified as immigrants/refugees/asylum seekers
  - 2.6% (3) identified as veterans
  - 1.7% (2) identified as LGBTQ



## Performance Measures: Services Provided – Information & Referral

- 1 individuals was assisted with information & referral services
- 5 information and/or referral instances were provided\*:
  - 40.0% (2) provided information about the criminal justice system
  - 40.0% (2) provided information about victim rights
  - 20.0% (1) provided referral information to other services, supports, and resources





# Performance Measures: Criminal/Civil Justice System Assistance

- 221 individuals were provided criminal/civil justice system assistance services
- 855 criminal/civil justice system assistance instances:
  - 72.4% (619) engaged in assistance for a civil legal attorney in family law services
  - 17.0% (145) engaged in assistance for a civil legal attorney in restraining order services
  - 10.4% (89) were provided with other legal advice and/or services
  - 0.2% (2) were provided immigration attorney assistance
