- 47 individuals participated in Listening Circles

- 32 adults who received resource support such as employment, life skills, anger management, transportation, disability benefits assistance, etc.




Listening Circle Participants

- Number of people who participated in Listening Circles: 47
 - 91.5% (43) identified as Black
 - 8.5% (4) identified as White
 - 80.9% (38) identified as Female
 - 19.1% (9) identified as Male
- 47 individuals responded to ethnicity inquiry as Non-Hispanic or Latinx

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- 19.1% (9) of those individuals identified as Male
- 80.9% (38) of those individuals identified as Female


Mentor & Connections

My Daddy Taught Me That is a program for youths ages 12-19 (grades 6 – 12).

- Average number of youth engaged with mentorship program by Neighborhood per month:
 - An average of 20 youths were from a neighborhood other than those listed
 - An average of 11 youths were from the Lee Walker Heights Neighborhood
 - An average of 8 youths were from the Erskine/Walton Neighborhood
 - An average of 5 youths were from the Ledgewood Neighborhood
 - An average of 4 youths were from the Hillcrest Neighborhood




Average Number of Youth Engaged with All MDTMT Programs per Month





Resource Support

- Number of adults who received resource support such as employment, life skills, anger management, transportation, disability benefits assistance, etc.: 32
 - 71.9% (23) identified as Black or African American
 - 28.1% (9) identified as White
 - 65.6% (21) identified as Male
 - 34.4% (11) identified as Female



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Community Engagement Participants

- Community engagement activities are any daily, weekly, or monthly activity meant to provide a positive interaction between youths and adults within areas of our community. These activities can include bingo games, daily sports involvement, community meetings, and canvassing.
- 1,619 individuals interacted with via various community engagement activities
 - 63.9% (1,034) engaged identified as Hillcrest residents
 - 14.8% (240) engaged identified as Maple Crest residents
 - 7.4% (120) engaged identified as Lee Walker Heights residents
 - 6.2% (100) engaged identified as Deaverview residents
 - 6.2% (100) engaged identified as Pisgah View residents
