### Sweet Birch Betula lenta

- Fast-growing with bright yellow-gold fall foliage
- Dark, shiny, lenticled bark traditionally used to produce wintergreen oil
- Tolerates moist, sandy, and rocky soils
- Deer and fire resistant
- Host plant for mourning cloak and dreamy duskywing butterflies, supports songbirds

### **Washinton Hawthorn** Crataegus phaenopyrum

- Small, thorny tree with fragrant white blossoms in late spring, red-orange to purple fall foliage, and bright, shiny red, edible berries that last into winter
- Supports a variety of pollinators, songbirds, game birds, and small mammals
- Can be pruned into a hedge
- Deer resistant, tolerates heavy clay

## **Common Witch-hazel** Hamamelis virginiana

- Shrub/small tree with attractive fall foliage and fragrant yellow flowers that persist after leaf drop
- Typically grows in a rounded clump about as wide as it is tall
- Supports pollinators, songbirds, and turkey
- Tolerates deer browse, heavy clay, and erosion

## **Eastern Redbud**

Cercis canadensis

- Adaptable understory tree with showy spring blooms that provide early nectar for pollinators
- In the pea family young leaves, buds, and flowers are edible!
- Sensitive to herbicide

## Persimmon

Diospyros virginiana

- Small fragrant flowers bloom May-June
- Delicious, date-like orange fruits mature in the fall after the first frost and are a favorite of possums and deer
- Distinctive, gray blocky bark
- Spectacular yellow to flame-like fall foliage

### Paw Paw Asimina triloba

- Fruit tastes similar to a mango or papaya (require at least two trees and adequate sun for fruit production)
- Develop clumps/thickets in forest understory, but typically assumes pyramid shape in sunny locations with dark green leaves turning yellow in Fall

## **Downy Serviceberry**

Amelanchier arborea

- Multi-stemmed small tree/large shrub that can be pruned into a variety of forms including borders or specimen tree
- Fragrant white flowers and edible berries provide high wildlife value
- Tolerates a range of conditions

### **Black Chokeberry** Aronia melanocarpa



- Spreading, multi-stemmed shrub that tolerates a wide variety of conditions including boggy soils
- Excellent for riparian and wetland areas
- Flowers and fruit add high wildlife and pollinator value
- Fruits are edible to humans but astringent




### Silky Dogwood Cornus amomum



- Thicket-forming shrub that thrives along ponds, streams, and wetlands
- Excellent choice for erosion control and streambank stabilization
- Flowers and fruit add high wildlife and pollinator value
- Resistant to deer, black walnut, drought

### **Arrowwood Viburnum**

Viburnum dentatum

- Medium-sized shrub that works well as a specimen or pruned into a hedge
- Tolerates a wide variety of soils and thrives along wetlands, ponds, or streams
- Attracts pollinators, songbirds, grouse and turkev

Full sun - part shade	Moist, well drained	5 - 10 ft	Early spring



### Sweetshrub Calycanthus floridus

- Also known as Carolina allspice, this large shrub produces large, fragrant burgundy flowers followed by dark, glossy leaves
- Can be shaped with pruning or allowed to spread and naturalize via suckers
- Attracts pollinators and songbirds
- Deer and fire resistant

### Buttonbush Cephalanthus occidentalis



- Unique spherical flower clusters; glossy green foliage turns yellow in fall
- High value to bees, butterflies, and birds
- Excellent addition to rain gardens, riparian, and wetland areas
- Prune to shape after flowering

## Coralberry

Symphoricarpos orbiculatus



- Low, dense, colonial shrub that provides great ground cover and excellent erosion control
- High value to pollinators and wildlife
- Need more than one individual to produce bright pink berries in fall that last into winter

## **Elderberry**





- Year-round interest with large clusters of fragrant white flowers, dark purple-black berries, and yellow fall foliage
- Fast-growing and aggressively outcompetes weeds
- Excellent erosion control for moist slopes
- Attracts pollinators, birds, and wildlife

### **Pussywillow** Salix discolor



- Silvery-gray catkins in the spring and yellow fall foliage provide seasonal interest
- Highly tolerant of wet soil and valued for wetland restoration and erosion control
- Early nectar source for pollinators

## **Black Willow** Salix nigra



- Large, fast-growing willow that thrives in wet conditions
- Spreading, shallow root system is excellent for soil retention and erosion control
- Best suited for naturalized areas as it is prone to breakage and can be messy
- Larval host to several pollinators

## PLANTING BAREROOT SAPLINGS

- Keep roots moist until planting.
- Dig a hole twice the size of the root system.
- Loosen the soil throughout the hole and on the walls of the hole.
- Minimize any amendments such as compost and organic matter in the planting hole.
- DO NOT add fertilizer into the hole as this may burn the young roots.
- Ensure root flare (where the first main roots attach to the trunk) is above the soil line.
- Backfill the hole and press the soil firmly around the base to ensure there are no air pockets.
- Water the tree thoroughly after planting.
- Provide at least one inch of water to the tree weekly during the growing season for the first year.




## **River Oats**Chasmanthium latifolium



- Low-maintenance clumping grass with large, attractive seed heads
- Seeds turn coppery -brownish purple in the fall
- Self-seeds and can spread aggressively, excellent erosion control in moist areas
- High value to wildlife, especially birds

Part shade - full shade	Moist - wet	2 - 4 ft	Late summer



### Indian Grass Sorghastrum nutans



- Hardy bunchgrass with showy yellow gold flower heads in the fall
- Good erosion control, drought tolerant, and deer resistant
- Self-seeding, can cut it back to the ground in late winter to early spring just before the new growth appears

# **Little Bluestem**Schizacharium scoparium

- Blue-green foliage turns to coppery color in the fall
- Forms narrow clumps well suited to borders and accents
- Highly drought tolerant and deer resistant.
- Attracts birds and butterflies

## Hay-scented Fern

Sitobolium punctilobulum

- Forms patches of fronds and provides softtextured ground cover
- Thrives in dry, rocky woodlands and clearings
- Arching, delicate fronds turn gold/yellow in the fall
- Resistant to deer and rabbits

# **Cinnamon Fern**Osmundastrum cinnamomeum



- Large clumping fern is long-lived and low-
- Grows easily in moist, boggy ground and thrives along streams and wetlands
- Extensive root systems stabilize wet soils
- Songbirds use the cinnamon-colored fibers at the base of the plant to line their nests

# PLANTING NATIVE GRASS PLUGS

- Keep plugs out of the sun and moist until planting to avoid drying out.
- Space plugs about 12" off center from each other, use a grid formation for mass/drift plantings.
- The hole depth should allow the plant's crown to lie at soil level.
- Water immediately after planting and apply mulch.

# "Brown Turkey" Fig Ficus carica

- Fast-growing, multi-stemmed fig that produces two yearly harvests
- Does well in containers if overwintered indoors
- Although a cold-hardy variety, needs protection from temperatures under 10 degrees
- Self-pollinating, can plant singly

## "Wolf River" Apple Malus domestica

- Large heritage apple known for frost-hardiness and disease resistance
- Fruit is relatively dry, fine-textured, and moderately acidic
- Favored for cooking, baking, and especially prized for apple butter
- Requires a different variety for pollination

Sun	Zone	Size	Harvest
Full sun	4 - 8	12 - 16 ft	Mid-Sept Early Oct.



# "Honeycrisp" Apple Malus domestica

- A popular commercial variety with a cold-hardy, compact tree
- Juicy, sweet, and tart fruit is ideal for fresh eating and baking
- Stores well in dry, cool conditions
- Pollinate with another variety

Full sun	3 - 8	12 - 15 ft	Early Sept.

# "Heritage Red" Rubus idaeus

- A red ever-bearing variety with a moderate harvest in July and a heavy harvest in September that persists until frost
- Cold-hardy and self-pollinating
- Flavorful, firm fruit works well for fresh eating and cooking
- Tolerates poor soil

Sun	Zone	Size	Harvest
Full sun	4 - 8	4 - 6 ft	July & Sept.



# "Cumberland Black" Rubus occidentalis

- An heirloom cold-hardy, high-yield black raspberry variety
- Berries are medium-large and dark with deep flavor
- Known for vigorous growth and sweet berries
- Self-pollinating

Sun	Zone	Size	Harvest
Full sun	4 - 9	4 - 6 ft	Sept.

## PLANTING BERRY BUSHES

- All berries come as bare root seedlings.
- Set plants 4 8 feet apart.
- Dig holes twice the size of the root mass.
- Set the plant 2 inches deeper than it was growing in the nursery, keeping the crown (where the roots meet the stem) at or above the soil level.
- Fill the hole with the soil, firm around roots and water deeply. Mulch with 3-4 inches of compost or pine needles.
- Do not fertilize until leaf out.
